So I tried again, asking this time for specific links. Here's where the fail got interesting...

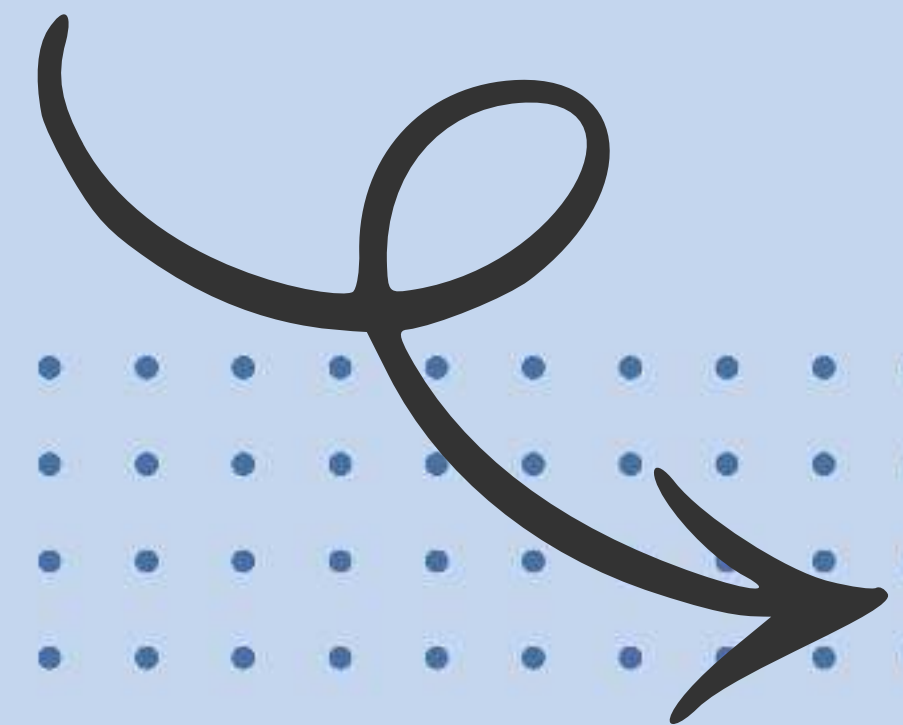

I asked ChatGPT why it couldn't give me links to those. Here's what it thinks is the problem...



How did you have access to Nordstorm, tentree and Quince but couldn't get specific links for Rains, Acne studios etc?

Good question — the short answer is: I didn't actually have direct product-database access to any of those retailers. What happened was a limitation of the search tool I used.

Here's what's going on under the hood:

1 The web tool can search webpages, not retailer inventory databases

The tool I used can:

- search the web
- open and read webpages

But it cannot query live retailer inventory systems (like Nordstrom's internal stock API, Shopify stores, etc.). So I can only see whatever a webpage publicly shows.

2 Why Nordstrom / Tentree / Quince appeared

Those came up because:

- Their product pages are easy for search engines to index
- Editorial pages or product pages appeared quickly in search results
- I could see that those pages mentioned size availability or stock messaging

However, that does not guarantee real-time stock, and I shouldn't have implied it was verified live inventory.

3 Why Acne / Rains didn't show up with direct product links

A few reasons those brands didn't surface quickly:

- Designer sites often block indexing of product inventory pages
- Many rely on JavaScript storefronts that search tools can't fully parse
